

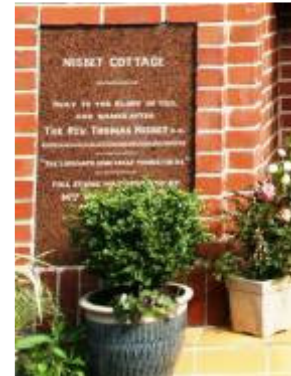
Nisbet Cottage is situated on a half-acre property on the hills to Otago Peninsula with outstanding views of Dunedin, and only seven minutes drive from the town centre.



The house was built in 1928 as part of the Presbyterian Support Services Association Glendining Children's Home Complex and named after Reverend Thomas Nisbet.

The history of child care in Dunedin dates back to 1849 when Reverend

Thomas Burns placed the four orphaned children of Mr. and Mrs. Harrison, who both died of cholera, in foster care. Until 1991, Nisbet Cottage was associated with Presbyterian Support and at that stage catered for teenagers in a family group situation. The house was bought by Hildegard and Ralf Lübcke in 1996, who have restored and modernised the property in keeping with its historic character and heritage.



Today, **Nisbet Cottage** offers luxury accommodation in two spacious suites. A large sundeck, accessible from the private guest lounge, offers panoramic views of Dunedin and the hills beyond. The garden has undergone extensive re-planting and now attracts an increasing number of native birds.

There are 2 restaurants within easy walking distance and a regular bus service to the city. Courtesy transport is available.
